Sam Surdi, Communications

2021 was another challenging year with Covid affecting normal club operations. Just like 2020, the Club was unable to run our normal schedule of events and activities. Entering 2022 we are still facing these challenges but we are starting to plan normal club events again. 2021 was also a difficult year for scheduling due to Covid and Long Center renovations. Because of these challenges a few changes were made to our regular communication to club members.

The email blast was changed from weekly to monthly due to the low open rate of our email blasts and lack of STTC events and activities due to Covid. The frequency of email blasts may change as we return to normal operations. Conrad has taken control over most of our Facebook management. We currently have more than 1,100 followers on Facebook. This is currently our number one avenue to reach our members and local table tennis players. Conrad has continued to build our Facebook following.

After our first tournament and league plans of 2022 are complete and flyers are made we will send an event email blast. We will also continue to communicate the success of our competitive players and coaches.

Summary

The Club gained a net of 11 new members in 2021 bringing the total to 141, five shy of the record set in 2016. Total revenue from basic memberships was \$4730, exceeding 2020's total by \$710, and extra donations increased by \$440 to \$640.

The annual membership count has averaged 125 in recent years with a low in 2014 of 72 and a high in 2016 of 146. With 74% of members reporting dates of birth, the mean age is 56.5 and the median is 58. Consequently, the attrition rate could increase in the coming years.

Items for Discussion

Encouragement of payment and reinstatement of membership by expired members who are playing regularly, and solicitation of membership from new individuals who are playing with some degree of frequency.

Consideration of incentives for new members and/or renewing members and/or members who refer someone new.

A potential increase in the annual membership fee as the demand is likely inelastic and the current fee structure is low compared to other clubs.



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Conrad Fisher, Friday Night League

The Friday League, or the Clash, or The League of Extraordinary Table Tennis Players as it has been variously known, had a good time this past year. We averaged 14 players at each monthly event from February through December with a high of 20 players and no fewer than 11 competitors on two occasions. This past year we used several different competition formats depending on the number and skill level of the field, sometimes creating different divisions of play based upon the skill level of the participants and at other times hosting a single competitive division, usually with a round robin format with the top players often advancing to an elimination round. Rudy Santo was of immense help in running the league this year and this next year we hope to conduct it in a manner which will continue to generate interest among the players throughout the year.

In July we had had a round robin doubles event won by the team of Zhe Xing Xiong and Felipe Ruiz. Later in the year, when we ran out of trophies and medals, we shifted to awarding cash prizes to the finalists, charging a small entry fee and awarding 80% of the proceeds to the finalists and keeping 20% for the club.

Over the course of the year, Artem Puskarov was regarded as the top player, by virtue of his three wins which came in February, March and December. Ke-ro Mikhaeil won twice, in April and September as did Felipe Ruiz who won in May and November. Kit Jeerapaet won in his only outing in October as did Garth Jordan in August and Zhe Xing Xion in June.

For the coming year, 2022, we have a goal of increasing participation so that the league, which was once somewhat regarded as being an event reserved for the club's more highly skilled level players, will begin attracting club players of all skill levels and, quite possibly, to attract novice players to the sport as well. That goal has been limited because the league has met on Friday nights, not the most popular night, at Ross Norton, where we have been limited to just a little over two hours of play time.

This year the league will continue to schedule most events at Ross Norton, but we will also look to move some play to Saturdays at the Long Center, at least a few times throughout the year, where we have more tables, more players and more time to conduct the event.

Conducting the "Saturday Smash" at the Long Center will allow many of our players who do not participate in tournaments to participate in competitive events which will include divisions based on their skill level and, in other months, we will utilize the USATT single game 41 point handicap system which has been very popular at past US Opens. This handicap format will allow less skilled players to play regular competitive matches with higher rated players and strengthen our table tennis community. The Broward TTC has a monthly



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handicap tournament which is enormously popular and regularly produces winners from all rating levels. These monthly events should continue to be self-funding and a small source of revenue for the club.

Martin Shapiro, Treasurer

For the year 2021, STTTCI had a total income of \$7,960 and total expenditures of \$6,207 for a net profit for the year of \$1,753. Both the income and expenses were significantly less than 2021 due to the lack of any tournaments during the year. The net profit for the year was almost the same as for 2021.

Our cash on hand at the beginning of the year on January 1, 2021 was \$25,177.51, and ended the year on December 31, 2021 at \$26,930.36. Our Table Inventory value at the beginning of the year was \$11,307.73, and ended the year at \$10,250.63, which includes the purchase of six new tables during the year for \$3,931 and the de-acquisition of five tables for \$1,025 in donations. We also donated a depreciated table to the VA. The end-of-year Table Inventory value includes \$4,186 in depreciation in 2021. We currently have 48 tables in inventory, which includes 3 tables which have reached their end of-life depreciated value in 2021 or before. Our twenty Europa tables will reach end-of-life depreciation by the end of 2022.

Income from annual and seasonal membership donations in 2021 were \$4,730 for the year, as compared with \$3,685 in 2020, an increase of \$1,045.00 in membership donations. There were additional member donations of \$640, as compared with \$200 in 2020. There was also \$440 in income from the Junior Program (John and Ed's donations), \$85 in income from the League and \$375 net profit from the Calendar That Cares fundraiser (down from \$785).

This year's proposed budget follows last year's budget due to continuing pandemic conditions. The only anticipated income in the budget is from membership dues, the Calendar That Cares fundraiser, the League and John & Ed's coaching donations. Although tournaments may resume this year, I have not included any in this year's budget as they may or may not take place, and in any case they usually more than cover their own expenses. Hopefully any tournament that does take this place will attract enough players to be profitable.

Based on the budget projections for 2022, only \$1,500 is included for the purchase of any new tables in the 2022 budget. Donations for de-acquisition of any tables replaced potentially could add funds for the purchases. Any additional amounts would need BOD approval for expenditure from cash reserves. But I encourage that the Board push off all table acquisitions beyond this year if the life of our current tables can be extended through repairs.
